PRESIDENT'S CORNER



Since our last Newsletter, we have received a very complimentary letter from Rivi Frankle, the Assistant Vice-president Alumni and Development of our University. She thanks the Senior Alumni "for all the wonderful work that you do for the university." In particular she refers to the many volunteers that pro-

vide assistance in many areas, the Margaret Higgins Memorial Scholarship Fund and the Arpin piano concert. Rivi concludes her letter with the following: "Volunteers are an important and vital part of this university and the commitment and dedication of the Senior Alumni Association is greatly appreciated." There is however, an ebb and flow in the availability of volunteer projects, so we are presently seeking new fields of service. If you have indicated that you are willing to be a volunteer and have not yet received a call, please be patient, the next call may be for you.

I am delighted to report to you that contributions of \$61,663 have been made to the Margaret Higgins Memorial Fund. Of that total, \$50,000 (our original goal) is invested in the Margaret Higgins Memorial Ontario Graduate Scholarship in the Humanities and Social Sciences. This amount will be matched by the university and the Government of Ontario to provide an annual scholarship of \$15,000 to support the work of graduate students with the first such award to be available next fall

The remaining \$11,663, together with any further contributions that may be received will be used to establish a second fund, which matched by the U. of T. will provide at least \$1,000 in support of graduate students each year in perpetuity.

Heartfelt thanks to all of you who have contributed to the fund in Margaret's memory.

The John Arpin concert was completely sold out and we congratulate Doug Philp on this very pleasurable event.

Our fall season of Canadian Perspectives is in full swing and we thank those who year after year provide our alumni and their friends with interesting and topical lectures.
